

A deed of Trust between Jonathan T. Griffith of the first part, William D. Deane of the second part and Isaac Barnes of the third part was acknowledged by the parties thereto their act and deed and ordered to be recorded.

A deed of bargain and sale between James Vick and Delilah his wife of the one part, Gilbert O. Vick of the other part was acknowledged by the said James Vick to the deed and together with a certificate thereto annexed of the privy examination and judgment of the wife ordered to be recorded.

Louisa Simmons widow of Benjamin Simmons dec^d by her certificate is relinquished her right to the administration of her said deceased husband's estate in person applying for the administration on said estate. It is ordered that the estate of the said Benjamin Simmons be committed to the hands of James T. Mayhew of this County for administration according to Law.

Ordered that Jubilee L. Simmons, John Simmons, Joseph Drury and Asa Lewis three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the peace for that purpose to all the personal estate of Benjamin Simmons dec^d and return the appraisement in their hands to Court.

On motion of Sarah Briggs ordered that she be exempt from the payment of taxes for her Slave Lucinda in future. She being infirm.

Ordered that the estate of James Washington dec^d be committed to the hands of James Hopfburg Sheriff of this County for administration according to Law.

This day came the parties by their Council and the Comptroller of the Court who were made in this cause at November Court 1838 to make division of the property mentioned this day made the following report. "The Comptroller agrees to divide the land allotted unto the widow Priscilla Bryant widow of Brillion Bryant dec^d and to the said dec^d husband Brillion Bryant agreeable to the lot of our judgment. The land is at a scrub oak in Cedar's Harris line, then down the lane near South to the house on the line near West to a small pond, across thence near South to the head of the gum Spring branch, thence down the said branch to a small pond, said pond to the little Swamp, thence the little Swamp with all its land to the within bounds to the beginning, the remainder we suppose to be not worth dividing. In each legation of the dec^d therefore we have not made a distribution of the land. Given under our hands this 17th day of Feb^y - 1840 Henry Kendrick Clerk. Richard Porten".
