It appearing to the Court that said McMahon is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming and thereupon he together with James Magee his security entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty of One hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs.

On the motion of Henry Blaw who made oath and together with Council Roberts and John McFarley his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twelve hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him of his return of letters of administration on the estate of John Wilson dec'd in due form.

Ordered that Miles Story, John C. Beale, Richard J. Darden and Thomas Allen or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of John Wilson dec'd and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.
