Drake & Thomas D. Merrill were sworn a grand jury of inquest upon the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and presented.

Richard Edmunds for and against in the body of George Camp in the County of Southampton with a chair on the 19th day of January 1840 on the information of the said George Camp who as juror in Court and sent to the grand jury at the request. also

Mills Pope and Lewis Feltz for fighting before the Sheriff's Office in the County of Southampton on the 20th day of January 1840 on the information of Jesse T. Buchanan and John T. Harris two of their body - and the grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

Ordered that the persons this day presented by the grand jury be summoned to present next to their cause, if any they can, why an Information should not be laid against them upon said presentments -

On motion of Jacob Williams. Ordered that the account of the said Williams accounted on Elisha Williams and Elijah Williams estate be recommended to the Comptroller who reported it for him to reconsider and report thereon.

Ordered that Master Comptroller both examine State and settle James Taylor guardianship of Mary Williams and report the same to Court with any motion specially stated demand preferred by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the motion of Rice D. Pierce administrator of Peter J. Pierce dec^d. Ordered that Master Comptroller both examine State and settle an account of the said Peter's administration on said estate and make report thereof to Court with any motion specially stated demand preferred by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the motion of William A. Jones guardian to the orphans of Thomas A. Smith dec^d. and it appearing to the Court that the interest of the said estate is sufficient for their support. It is ordered that the guardian be permitted to use so much of the principal of the said estate as will be sufficient to pay the balance of bond for the year remaining due after exhausting the profits of said estate and that he also apply so much of the principal of said estate after the interest is received to pay the bond of the orphans for the last preceding year.

On the motion of James D. Maysburg curator of Jordan Stearns dec^d. Elizabeth Stearns and it appearing to the Court that the orphans estate is sufficient for their support. Ordered that the said Maysburg be authorized
