

Said commissioners &c (as agreed upon by unanimous consent of all parties interested),
 Lewis a balance of \$5466.60 actually amt. was divided into two equal parts 1/2 part
 or \$911.00 was paid over to John E. Nicholson adm. of Charles Freeman dec. 1/2 part or \$911.00 was paid over to the said John E. Nichol-
 son adm. of Henry Hart dec. 1/2 part or \$911.00 to Eldridge E. Atkinson adm.
 of Samuel Hart. 1/2 to Charles Hart in his own right 1/2 part to the said Charles
 Hart Exor. of John Hart the younger. The remaining 1/2 part to which Samuel
 was entitled was subdivided into five equal shares making \$182.30 1/2 share
 one share was paid to John E. Nicholson as adm. Charles Freeman dec. - one like
 part paid to said John E. Nicholson as adm. Henry Hart. - a like part was paid
 over to Charles Hart in his own right, one like part was paid over to the said Charles Hart
 as Exor. of John Hart dec. and one like part to the said Charles Hart as adm. of

 these words to wit - "To the Court of Southampton City - The undersigned two of the
 Commissioners acting under the foregoing order of the Court, respectfully report.
 That the work which they were authorized to have constructed was duly completed
 for for the sum of seventy two dollars charged by Shagors Larn and has been complete
 to their satisfaction. They also consider it a part of their duty to state in
 that the portion of new road leading to and from the bridge above specified is
 likewise completed and in ordinary traveling order. The same being voluntarily
 undertaken and executed by the neighboring people, under an assurance of the
 Court that when finished it should be received on the parting of the public road.
 The undersigned recommend that the whole should be received, and that the Court
 if please would assign to the use of the road of which this newly made part
 is designed to be connected, some five or six additional hands and which they
 understand can be well spared from the neighboring highway. Respectfully
