This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed by the Court to make division of the lands of which Aaron Noflet died seized this day made the following report to wit: "According to the annexed decree of the worshipful Court of Southampton County to us directed. We the undersigned Commissioners as expressed in said decree, in obedience to the requisitions thereof have proceeded to divide the lands of which Aaron Noflet died seized, attended by Thomas H. Morrell as Surveyor, who found them to be in the whole of 127 hundred and thirty five acres, which we have divided as follows to wit: Beginning at the flat swamp at a new corner for Lot No 3, thence along a new line of marked trees S 29° E N 150 poles to a new corner for Lot 2, on North Jones land, thence along said North Jones line S 67° E 80 poles to a walnut tree, thence S 41° E 41 poles to a post a new corner, thence along a new line of marked trees N 67° E 80 poles to a corner in Benjamin Waller line, thence along his line to the run of the flat swamp, thence up the run of said swamp to the beginning. We have allotted to three young children, Eveline, Adeline and John Noflet the whole of the above described land to have possession thereof at the decease of the widow. We have also allotted to them twenty seven and half acres adjoining the said dower land, and the lands of North Jones and Benjamin Waller which makes One hundred and forty eight acres to be divided between them at the decease of the widow aforesaid which we consider to be their proportion in value of the whole tract of land. The balance of the One hundred and forty eight acres we have divided as follows: Lot No 1 containing fourteen half acres drawn by Angelina Noflet and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a spruce standing on the path near the school house on Nathaniel Jones land a corner for the lands drawn by Benjamin Brown, Jr, in right of his wife and thence, thence along said Brown line N 29° E 42 poles to a post a corner for Lot No 2, thence along Lot No 2 S 68° E 38 poles to a corner for Lot No 2 & 8, thence along Jones
