

The Court certifies that William D. Hendry who wishes to obtain a license to practice the law has resided in this County for the last preceding twelve months, that he is a person of honest manners and upwards of twenty one years of age.

On the motion of Jacob Barnes. Ordered that the estate of George Williams deceased be committed to the hands of Thomas Butler Sheriff of this County for administration according to Law.

Ordered that Jonathan Dardot, Darius W. Bryant, William Danks and Jacob Barnes any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of George Williams dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to be read.

James Wells is appointed Surveyor of the road from the sign near South Wells to Joseph Hurdwicks place in the town of Thomas Lawrence removed, and it is ordered that the same be laid out with them.

On the motion of Benjamin Griffin Sheriff and Committee of the estate of William Lawrence dec^d Ordered that the unadministered estate of Randolph Edwards deceased be committed to the hands of Thomas Butler Sheriff of this County for administration according to Law.

On the motion of Benjamin Griffin Sheriff and Committee of the estate of William Lawrence dec^d Ordered that the estate of Elizabeth Edwards deceased be committed to the hands of Thomas Butler Sheriff of this County for administration according to Law.

On the motion of John M. Neale who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law and with Walter Wyck his County entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs a license is granted him to keep an ordinary at New depot in this County till May next. It appearing to the Court that the said Neale is a man of good character and not addicted to drinking or gaming.

On the motion of the Potomac and Romshe Rail Road Co. and it appearing to the Court that due notice has been given. It is Ordered that Benjamin Mallow, Nathaniel Jones, John Edwards, James Graham and John Whitehead or any three of them being first duly sworn according to Law, do on the second Saturday in June next appraise the damages of the lands belonging to the heirs of Abner P. Smith through which the Potomac and Romshe Rail Road pass, lying on the north side of the Meherrin River and bounded by the lands of John
