

And the Judge order and decree that William Brown, Patrick Ross, and Mathew Wells be appointed Commissioners, any two of whom may act, that they advertise the bonds for twenty days and show sell the thirty five acres were a lot to the highest bidder upon credit of six months, and take double with good security one fourth part of the amount of sale and assign the same to the Court in due and right, the other two bonds to be of equal amount, if the residue, which they will offer to the guardians of the infants respectively and report to the Court in order to a final decree.

On the motion of Nathaniel Francis. Ordered that Master Commissioner Belt examine State and settle an account of said Francis' administration on Russell Muspes estate and report the same to the Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the motion of Peter Edwards. Ordered that Master Commissioner Belt examine State and settle an account of the said Peter Edwards' administration on Thomas Briggs estate and report the same to the Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the motion of Peter Edwards. Ordered that Master Commissioner Belt examine State and settle an account of the said Peter Edwards' guardianship of Virginia A Edwards and report the same to the Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

William Paul is appointed surveyor of the road from the forks of the road at the late residence of Stephen Hardin to Jerusalem in the name of the said Hardin deceased, and it is ordered that the usual bonds be made thereon.

For reasons appearing to the Court The Indentures by which Augustus sometimes called by the name of Gardner, a mulatto boy, was bound to Thomas R Gray are hereby recorded.
