We took bonds of the purchaser for the above sums and assigned them to the parties entitled. We then proceeded to make division of the dower lands as directed in the said decree as follows. To wit. N<sup>o</sup> 1. To Louisa Martin to wit a Mary and child Dick Henry Jones and to receive of Joseph Drury \$87.50 - N<sup>o</sup> 2. To Joseph Drury to wit Henry to pay Louisa Martin \$87.50. Benj<sup>n</sup> & Applegate \$37.50 cents & to Edwin Simmons \$12.50. N<sup>o</sup> 3. To Benjamin Applegate to wit Man David & girl Fanny and to receive from Joseph Drury \$37.50 cents - N<sup>o</sup> 4. To Edwin Simmons to wit boys Dennis Charles and to receive of Joseph Drury \$12.50 cents. Given under our hands this 18<sup>th</sup> day of February 1839. N. M. Seibell, Jesse Little, & L. Simmons. Whereupon by consent of parties by their Counsel it is decreed and ordered that the sale and division aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid made be held firm and stable and binding forever between the parties.

On the motion of Joseph Ingers guardians to Jane and Allen Ingers Order'd that the guardian be allowed to support out of the principal of his wards estate the sum of thirty dollars each for their support &c

Ordered that William R Colward who is hereby appointed special Commissioner for the purpose do state settle and adjust an account of Benjamin Drury's administration as Deceased Drury estate and make report thereof to Court
