 for sixty two dollars and seventy five cents, who agreed to pay four dollars and one
 cent for the old timbers not intended to be used in the repairs of the bridge, leaving the sum
 of fifty eight dollars and seventy four cents - The bridge below Cole Georges Blows mill
 was undertaken by James J. Newsum and Henry Peltway for thirty two dollars and fifty
 cents and the old timbers sold to Ingaline Selks for two dollars - The small bridge
 near the one last mentioned below Blows mill was undertaken by James J. Newsum &
 Henry Peltway for sixteen dollars, and the old timbers sold to Henry Peltway for one
 dollar and fifty cents - Given under our hands this 15th day of June eighteen hundred

The last Will and Testament of Sally Wynn deceased was proved by the oath of Joseph

 with Joseph Blanton and Henry Peltway his decessors executants and acknowledged a
 bond in the penalty of Ten thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is
 granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form.

The Commissioners appointed to let the rebuilding of two small bridges one near
 James Wells and the other near S^g Quay this day made a report which is ordered to be
 recorded and is these words to wit: In obedience to the honorable Court of Southampton
 County, October Court 1839 We your Commissioners did advertise the time and place of
 and did proceed to let the bridge across the road near South Quay and J. C. Smith became
 the undertaker for the sum of twenty dollars - at the same time and place we let the bridge
 near James Wells and Meredith Hollands become the undertaker at \$15.00 all of
 which has been done according to contract. Your order directed your Court to renew the
 same when completed all of which has been complied with. Given under our hand this
