She further declares that she was married to the said Lewis Hogg sometime in the year 1786. and produced to the Court a register of the births of her children in the hand writing of her said husband, in which it appeared that her eldest child was born on the 30th December 1787.

It is so.

Cooper Waller who is charged in oaths by Lemmus Simons a single free woman of this County with being the father of her bastard child this day appeared in Court, and the said Lemmus Simons and sundry witnesses were sworn and examined and the said Cooper Waller by his Counsel fully heard. The Court upon consideration of all the circumstances of the case doth adjudge the said Cooper Waller to be the father of the said bastard child in that the said child is likely to become chargeable to the County. Therefore doth order that the said Cooper Waller be charged with the annual payment twenty dollars to the Overseers of the Poor of the said County until the said child arrives to the age of seven years or else it dies so long, and that he also pay the costs of this prosecution. Whereupon the said Cooper Waller with Jesse Drury his security here in Court acknowledged themselves indebted unto Thomas W. Gilmer Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Cooper Waller in the sum of One hundred and thirty dollars and the said Jesse Drury in the like sum of One hundred and thirty dollars of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements to be valued and to the said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Cooper Waller shall observe and perform the above order of the Court made against him then this recognizance to be void.

Ordered that Peter F. Bozeman, John D. Hart and William Orms or any two of them let to the lowest undertaker the repairs or rebuilding, as they may see fit, of New Creek bridge, receive the same when completed and make report thereof to the Court.

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that the Overseers of the Poor bind make John Henry, Fanny Syler's children of Nancy Setts f.m. to Mrs. Prather according to law, and covenant with the said Mrs. Prather that she pay to the said mother the following sums for said apprentices to wit. for Marthas the sum of \$4 per year, John Henry \$15 per year. Fanny Syler's \$4 per year each after they respectively arrive to fourteen years of age. the amounts for the last years to be paid to the said apprentices respectively.

The Commissioners appointed to let the repairs of the Jail of this County this day made a report which is ordered to be recorded and is in these words to wit. "According to an order of Court made at January Term 1840. We the undersigned did let to Thomas G. Jones, being the lowest bidder, the repairs of the Jail of this County for the sum of \$500. the said repairs have been completed and received by us. Given under our hands this 27th day of May 1840. N. M. Seibell, J. R. Edwards."
