This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant not appearing to respond the attached effects. It is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant the sum aforesaid due him proved to be just, and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that the Constable make sale of the attached effects aforesaid according to law, therewith pay and satisfy this judgment to the plaintiff and the expenses of any, costs to the Defendant and that he return an account of such sale to Court.
