The Commissioners appointed by the interdictory decree made in this cause at March Term last, to make the dunnin there directed this day returned their report which is ordered to be on Sum. which reports in these words to wit: In conformity to the aforesaid decree, we the undersigned Commissioners have valued and divided the slaves belonging to the estate of Elias Summrell dec'd and alloted to each legatee their respective portions in the following manner: (Vizt.) The whole of the slaves are valued to the sum of \$8850 and there are five legatees. \$8850 divided into five parts make \$1770 to be each man's part - Lot No. 1 contains the following slaves and their valuations: Boy Henry at \$150, Sham \$200, Ridley \$325, and America \$450, making \$1125 - old woman Tanager at \$100 for keeping taken off leaves \$125, which makes \$145 to make the proportion of \$30 of which comes from Lot No. 3 and \$15 from Lot No. 4. The above lot No. 1 was drawn by William H. Summrell as and for his proportion. Lot No. 2 contains the following slaves and their valuations: Billy at \$100, Jefe at \$300, Kinton \$500, Rebecca \$100, & Edmund \$100, making \$1000, which is \$30 over the share which is to go to Lot No. 1, as above stated - This lot No. 2 was drawn by Joseph B. Kennell in right of his wife Sally Summrell as his proportion. Lot No. 3 contains the following slaves and their valuations: Boy Jefe junior at \$150, Althea at \$500, Leander \$200, & Caroline at \$200, making \$1050, which makes \$25 to make the amount, \$15 of which comes from Lot No. 4, and \$10 from Lot No. 5 which make the sum of \$1770 - This lot No. 3 was drawn by Richard S. Summrell as his proportion. Lot No. 4 contains the following slaves & their valuations: Grady \$100, William \$350, Hilda \$500, Celah \$100, Harris \$150, making \$1100, to Hannah at \$100 for keeping taken off leaves \$1000 which is \$30 over the share \$15 of which goes to Lot No. 3, and \$15 to Lot No. 1, as above which leaves \$1770 being the proportion. The above lot No. 4 was drawn by Thomas S. Summrell as and for his proportion - Lot No. 5 contains the following slaves and their valuations: Harby at \$350, Harrel \$550, Eliza and her children \$600, and Sally at \$75, making \$1775, which is \$5 over the proportion which is to be had to Lot No. 3, leaving the sum of \$1770 making the full proportion - The above Lot No. 5 was drawn by Sally Ann Summrell as and for her proportion. The foregoing is a true statement of the division of the slaves among the heirs of Elias Summrell dec'd all of which is respectfully submitted to the Court, Dated under our hands this 25th day of April 1840.
