

This Court certifies that satisfactory evidence was introduced proving that Henry Love a Revolutionary prisoner of the United States at the rate of \$31.77 cents per annum died on the 27th day of February 1840. that he resided in this County at the time of his death and that he left no widow child, or children.

On the motion of John W. Humeau who made oath and together with Thomas P. Humeau and Alexander Myrick his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs a certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration in the estate of Daniel R. Dulle deceased in due form.

Ordered that Henry Sillway, Barbara Means, Samuel Bachman and Joseph Alcott or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Daniel R. Dulle dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

The Court doth assign Thomas P. Humeau guardian to Lucy Anne Dulle orphan of Daniel R. Dulle dec^d and thereupon the said Thomas P. Humeau with John W. Humeau and Alexander Myrick his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of ten thousand dollars with condition according to law.

On the motion of William A. Jones who made oath and with Peter Edwards and John A. Brown his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs a certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration in the estate of Nancy M. Smith dec^d in due form.

Ordered that Henry Means, David Newman, Peter Edwards and James James or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Nancy M. Smith dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

William R. Edwards Clerk of this Court with Edwards Dulle his security entered into bond for the payment of the taxes and other public moneys which may come to his hands which bond was acknowledged by the obligors therein named and ordered to be recorded.

William M. Brown who hath been duly licensed to practice the law in the County of this Commonwealth, on his motion has leave to practice in this Court and thereupon he took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth and the oath of an attorney at law.
