

Prothon. Sheriff take the estate of the said John Mercer into his hands and administer the same according
to law.

Ordered that John Davis, Samuel H. Holmes, John Boykin &c and Bartholomew Bowers or any three
of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal
estate of John Mercer deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On the motion of Matthew R. Pope who made oath and together with William H. Nicholson and Richard
Bennett his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned
as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of
William Pope deceased in due form.

Ordered that Nathan Pope, Mills Pope, Richard Darden and Simon Pope or any three of
them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the
personal estate of William Pope deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On the motion of Matthew R. Pope who made oath and together with William H. Nicholson and Mills
Pope his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned
as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of
Esther Joyner deceased with her Will heretofore proved and recorded in this Court annexed in due form.

Nicholas a slave belonging to the estate of Nathaniel Bevill deceased who stands charged with having on
the 2d day of August 1848 at Roselle meeting house in this County feloniously assaulted, abused and
injured so nobly and indecently as this day set to the last in custody of the Sheriff of this County
(she Court summoned for his trial having failed to meet) and being arraigned pleaded not guilty
and thereupon divers witnesses were sworn and examined. Mrs. W. Nichols a negro supposed to be
about 13 or 14 years of age being duly charged and sworn testifies that at Roselle meeting house
in this County on Sunday the 23d day of August last when there was a collection of both black
and white people she heard the prisoner at the bar who with another negro from Petersburg
and several other negroes were standing together say he was going to rise and kill all the white
people on the next Saturday night or Sunday night thereafter and asked the other negro from
Petersburg if he would go with him he said he would and Nichols the prisoner said
he would join him - the conversation lasted about half an hour - She first saw the prisoner
between the meeting house and well going along with one under his arm when she next saw him
it was at the place where the conversation above referred to was held - Reporting to his master
the witness said the other negro from Petersburg asked Nichols the prisoner first if he would
join him - Nichols said he would - and the other negro said he would join Nichols to kill
all the white people two of the negroes present at the conversation were named Davy & Liza she
did not know the others - W. Nichols says she did not hear Nichols the prisoner or the other negro from
Petersburg ask any other negro friends if they would join them - Nichols was standing about
ten rods from Nichols when the conversation was going on and heard it distinctly - She the
witness spoke of the conversation to her Master Dick the day after it occurred, who related it
to his Master (who had she had known a some time) and Master's husband who spoke to
the witness about it in two or three days thereafter - Pelly negro woman being duly
