The Commissioners appointed by the interdictory decree made on this cause at August Term last to
make sale of the land as therein directed this day made a report which is in these words to wit
In conformity to the annexed decree the undersigned did (after duly advertising the same) sell
on the 24th day of September 1840 to the highest bidder the tract of land mentioned in said
decree and James H Love became the purchaser thereof for the sum of One hundred and twenty
one dollars. The costs and commissions attending the same is thirteen dollars and thirty eight cents
deducted from the amount of sales leaves the sum of one hundred and seven dollars sixty two
cents this sum divided into ^{four} equal parts make \$26.75 cents for which amount I have
taken James H Love's receipt for, having one half the amount sales - the other half I have
divided into four equal parts making the sum of \$10.45 1/4 cents each of the other legacies paid
and have taken from the said James H Love with John Vick his security four bonds of equal
amounts, one payable to Melly Seutchings, heir of Adam Seutchings, one other bond payable to
Mary Seutchings, one other bond payable to Betsey Seutchings, and one other bond payable to
William Seutchings - the two former bonds paid over to the parties and the two latter deposited in
the Clerk's Office, as by the decree I am directed - all of which actings and doings is respectfully
submitted to the Court. Given under my hand this 24th day of September 1840. Dms Griffin Senr.
And it is ordered that the said report be continued for one term.

returned and ordered to be recorded.

The Court doth assign William L. Reebelle guardian to Mary F and Martha C Reebelle nephews
of Nathaniel Reebelle dec^d and charges the said William L. Reebelle with Henry Lindsey and
Edward B. Bower his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand
dollars conditioned according to law.
