Paine be appointed Commissioners one two of whom may act, that they after advertising the time and place of sale for twenty days, sell to the highest bidder the eleven more acres which was allotted to the late Mr. Elizabeth Harris as dowry in her Deceased husband's estate. That they receive on the day of sale money enough to pay the costs of this decree. for the balance of the purchase money they are to allow a credit of six months, for which they are to take of the purchaser or purchasers bonds with good security, as follows. One fifth for one fifth part of the whole and assign the same to Peter Edwards in right of his wife, one third for one fifth and assign the same to the administrator of Robert T. Musgrave in right of A. Deacon, one fifth to the administrator of Richard Warren, one to John D. Mayler in right of his wife. The remaining one fifth they shall apportion betwixt the parties as follows, a whole share in said fifth to Peter Edwards in right of his wife, the administrator of Robert T. Musgrave, the administrator of Richard Warren, John D. Mayler in right of his wife, and the administrator of W. S. Harris, and half share to Edward Harris, the heir of Robert T. Musgrave and Mary C. Paine in right of her mother, and report to Court in order to a final decree.

In Chancery

This day this cause was debated by leave of Court and consent of parties and came on to be heard in the bill and answer and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth order adjournage and decree that Nathaniel Harris, Samuel Washam Sr. and John D. Parker be appointed Commissioners any two of whom may act, that they after advertising the time and place of sale for twenty days, sell to the highest bidder at public auction the lands whereof William L. Rockhills dec'd died, seized and possessed which were allotted by a decree of the Court to the heirs of Nathaniel Rockhills as their proportion of said lands in the County of Southampton upon a credit of six months, except for so much of the purchase money as may be necessary to pay the costs of this decree which they are directed to receive on the day of sale, that they take of the purchaser five bonds of equal amount with good personal security, and assign one of said bonds to each of the heirs of Nathaniel Rockhills who have attained their lawful age, in their own right, and assign the others to the legally qualified guardians of the infants respectively, and report their proceedings to the Court in order to a final decree.
