

Ordered that the Sheriff out of any contingent moneys in his hands pay unto Thomas & Jones Twenty dollars and Seventy five Cents the amount of his account.

Upon the petition of James Evans, Patrick Williams, Sally Williams and John Williams descendants of a female of the Nottingay Tribe of Indians. It appearing that the Trustees of the said Tribe of Indians have had due notice of this petition. It is ordered that the Trustees do ascertain and set apart to the petitioners their proportion of the estate, real and personal held in trust for the benefit of the said Tribe and make report thereof to Court. It appearing to the Court that the petitioners are not likely to become chargeable to any part of the Commonwealth.

The Court certifies that William D'Gueley who wishes to obtain a license to practice the law in the Courts of this Commonwealth has resided in this County for the last preceding twelve months, that he is a person of honest demeanor, and upwards of twenty five years of age.

On motion of Thomas Doyal. Ordered that James Holmes, Patrick Rose and James Williams being sworn before a Justice of the Peace do view the way proposed by said Doyal for altering a road as well as the present way and report to the Court the comparative conveniences and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the publice if such alteration be made as is proposed.

Samuel Revill of this County, who stands charged with having feloniously and maliciously stabbed Holliday Revill with intention in so doing of killing, wounding or maiming, disfiguring or disabling the said Holliday Revill was this day set to the bar in custody of the keeper of the Gaol of this County (the Court summoned for his examination having failed to meet). Whereupon for reason appertaining to the Court the examination of the said Samuel Revill is adjourned until the next Court. And as the sum of the said Samuel Revill has been allowed to give bond himself to be bound in the sum of One hundred Dollars with two securities to be bonds in the sum of fifty dollars each. And therefore the said Samuel Revill with James J French & Donisthorpe Whitefield his securities here in Court acknowledged themselves to be indebted unto Thomas W Gilmer Governor of this Commonwealth the said Revill in the sum of One hundred dollars and the said Securities in the sum of fifty dollars each of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Samuel Revill shall make his formal appearance before the Justices of the County Court of Shropshire at the Courthouse on the first day of the next Term of the said Court to answer the Commonwealth of the felonious offence aforesaid of which he stands charged then the above money and to be void or to remain in full force.
