This cause came on this day to be heard on the bill, answer and arguments of counsel, and was docketed by Court, on consideration whereof, the Court doth order, adjudge and decree, that all the estate real of which John Harris died seized and possessed be sold on a credit of six months except so much as may be necessary to defray the expenses of this suit. The sales shall be divided if possible for a division to take place, if not be sold for cash. and that the Commissioners hereafter named take seven bonds with good security in equal amounts and deliver them to the plaintiffs and defendants parties to this suit upon their executing to the Committee of the estate of John Harris the necessary and proper responding bonds. That is to say, the said Commissioners shall deliver one bond for one twelfth part of the funds arising from said sale to James B. Harris one bond of like nature to Randolph Harris, one to William L. Harris, one to D. C. Putney in right of his wife Elizabeth formerly Harris, one to Eubank R. Newman in right of his wife Mary formerly Harris, one to John Parker in right of his wife Nancy formerly Harris, and one to Jesse A. Byrnes as guardian to William A. Harris infant son of Miles Harris dec^d. And the Court doth further decree that Edwards shall be appointed Commissioner to sell and make conveyance of said property, and that the expenses of this suit be jointly borne by the parties.

On the motion of Owen Thomas Sheriff and Committee of the estate of John Harris dec^d Ordered that Lottens R. Edwards who is hereby appointed Commissioner for the purpose do state, settle and adjust an account of the said Harris' administration on his individual estate and make report to Court.

I writing in these words "In the name of God Amen. I these Bills of the County of Guilford Ave & State of Va. do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following, to wit: Item, first. It is my will & desire that all of my just debts should be paid. Item. I give and bequeath to Miss Joseph M. Lamm one hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my brother Lewis Fells fifty dollars to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath the balance of my estate to my brother Thomas' daughter Rebecca Fells to her and her heirs forever. I constitute and appoint my friend Nathaniel Thomas my sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this 13th day of January year of our Lord 1854.
