Deed of bargain and sale from Sayer Parker to Alfred Holt conveying a tract of 50 acres of land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 30th January 1841 by Sayer Parker and admitted to record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Edwards Rutts Benjamin James & Co to Joel Tucker conveying a tract of 200 acres of land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 30th January 1841 by Edwards Rutts and admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Joel Broadshaw of the first part, Samuel Beale of the second part and James Williams of the third part, conveying household & kitchen furniture, farming utensils &c was proved in the Clerk's Office the 1st day of February 1841 by Danfrey Deane John Jenkins and John Drake the witnesses thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of Release between Thomas J. Peller of the first part, Bennett D. Buffin of the second part and Thomas Peller of the third part, releasing a tract of 30 acres of land was acknowledged in the Office the 1st February 1841 by Thomas J. Peller and Thomas Peller two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

The account current of Benjamin Buffin's administration on John Broadshaw's estate having been taken and no exceptions being filed, was confirmed and ordered to be recorded.

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A Power of Attorney from Henry Edwards to John Ward was returned and together with the certificate thereto annexed ordered to be recorded.

An account current of Cass Bowers' administration on John Harris' estate was returned and ordered to lie on the Table for exceptions.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of the Peace for this County to the next Court to take into consideration the propriety of forming the bridge at Dorchester except William Rivers to show their duty on the said matter.

An account current of Benjamin Buffin's administration on Edith Broadshaw's estate was returned and ordered to lie on the Table for exceptions.
