Deed of Trust between Joel Wm. Dredshaw of the first part John R. Drak of the second part and James Williams of the third part, Conveying household & kitchen furniture, farming utensils &c was proved in the Clerks Office the 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 1821 by Dempsey Drak, John Jenkins and John Drak the witnesses thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of Release between Thomas J. Peltier of the first part Bennett P. Griffin of the second part and and Thomas Peltier of the third part releasing a tract of 20 acres of land was acknowledged in the office the 11<sup>th</sup> February 1821 by Thomas J. Peltier and Thomas Peltier two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

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Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of the Peace for this County to the next Court to take into consideration the property remaining the Bridge at Tiverton across River Taw to do some other Act or as the Justices direct.

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An account current of Benjamin Griffins administration on Coltho Stoddards estate was returned and ordered to lie over for exceptions.
