

(that) Slaves as set forth in the annexed order for the sum of two thousand four hundred and sixty five dollars, in a credit of nine months, from the 22nd day of December 1858 - subject to a drawback of twelve dollars and thirty eight cents and have assigned to Circuit Justices on behalf of the state, the bonds for the balance of the purchase money are retained in my hands subject to the call of the legal guardian of the heirs as set forth in said order. Respectfully Submitted, John J. Judkins Commissioner." Which report is ordered to lie on the floor for exceptions.

On the petition of James W. Parker for leave to alter a road near his house. The Commissioners appointed to view the way for said road to run this day made report which is in these words to wit: In virtue of the annexed Order, we have viewed the proposed change in the location of the road near James W. Parker & are unanimously of opinion that the public convenience will increase by the change while that of the said Parker will have been forwarded. Dated New London Decd. 10th 1858. Henry B. Vaughan. And upon consideration thereof it is ordered that the petitioners have leave to alter the road as proposed and that the old road be discontinued as soon as the new one be opened and put in good legal repair.

Ordered that James Mergel of Alexander Myrick who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose state settle and adjust Dardon W. Bryant's guardianship of Nathan J. Williams and make report thereof to Court.

On the motion of Alexander Myrick. Ordered that Thomas D. Morell and Jacob Barnes who are hereby appointed Special Commissioners for the purpose state settle and adjust an account of the said Myricks executorial proceedings on James Scammell's estate and make report thereof to Court.

On motion of Jacob Barnes Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies in future for his slaves. Slaves she being excepted.

The last Will and Testament of Barnwell Bryant deceased was proved by the oaths of Henry Signer and Wanton Taylor two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and the executors and administrator therein named refusing to take upon themselves the burden of the execution thereof in the motion of William J. Bryant who made oath and together with Henry Signer, James D. Bryant and John Bryant his deuteris entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs certificato granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the said Barnwell Bryant's estate with his said will annexed in
