The last will and Testament of Joshua Strood deceased was proved by the oaths of Gordon P. Griffen William H. Griffen and Bonet Lader the witnesses thereto and sworn to be recorded and on the motion of Benjamin Griffen one of the Executors herein named who made oath and together with Eli. Gruber and Robert P. Griffen his brothers entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for drawing a probate thereof in due form. James Jones the other executor therein named refused to take upon himself any part of the burden of the execution of said will.

Ordered that James Jones William H. Griffen Giles P. Whitney and Nathaniel Turner or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose to appear in all the personal estate of Joshua Strood deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On the motion Cloy Saylor Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of Taxes &c for his Slave Nancy in future she being aged and infirm.

On the motion of Thomas Pitts Sheriff of this County James H. Scott is permitted to qualify as his deputy during his pleasure, and therewith the said Scott qualified by taking the several oaths required by law. It appearing to the Court that the said Scott is a man of honest, probity and good character.
