This cause came on this day to be heard by consent of parties, on the bill and answer, was docketed by consent, and argued by Counsel, in consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge and order as follows, that William Briggs, Asyle Loring, Henry T. Briggs and Samuel B. Cross, every three of them, who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose precedent to divide the slaves in the bill mentioned namely Willis, Jane, Harry, Eliza & Roger, Rawlins, Betty, Sally, Solomon Dick, Maria, Louisa, Nat. Morris, Washington, Matilda, Abigail, Anna & Ammi, Mary Louise and Charlotte, being the slaves held by Rebecca D. Burles family Burley as slave slaves in the following proportion, that is to say, that they set apart and allot  $\frac{3}{10}$  part of the same (to wit, one tenth) to Willis, seven hundredths \$1000 thousandths of the value of the whole) to Edwards Burles as purchaser of the rights and interests of W<sup>m</sup>. D. Burley, a like proportion to the guardian of the infant complainant John W. Burley,  $\frac{1}{10}$  part of the same (to wit, one tenth two hundredths, four thousandths of the value of the whole) to the defendant Edwards Burles as administrator of his deceased wife Rebecca formerly Burley,  $\frac{1}{10}$  part of the same (to wit, no tenth three hundredths and five thousandths of the value of the whole) to the guardian of the infant complainant Anna D. Burles, a like proportion to the defendant Edwards Burles in his own right; and  $\frac{6}{10}$  part of the same (to wit, no tenth six hundredths and one thousandths of the value of the whole) to the guardian of the infant complainant James T. Burles; and that they make report of these proceedings, with a view to a final decree.
