An account of William N. Cobbold's guardianship of William H. Cobbold was returned and ordered to be recorded.

Accounts of George H. Gardner's guardianship of Elizabeth M., Isaac O., Lomia Jr. and Margaret Ann Gardner were returned and ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of Thomas Proctor Sheriff of this County Edwards Butts, William H. Cole, James D. Cobbold, Jose Drury and William H. Everett are permitted to give bail as his debtors during his pleasure, and thereupon they qualified by taking the oaths prescribed by law. It appearing to the Court that the said Edwards Butts, William H. Cobbold, James D. Cobbold, Jose Drury and William H. Everett are men of honest probity and good character.

Ordered that John Boykin, a Tinsmith 100 Broadhead and Joel Peppas or any two of them with commissioners appointed by the Court of Isle of Wight County, let to the lowest bidder the repairs of Broad Water bridge, near the same when completed and make report to Court.

James J. Williams having obtained an attachment against the estate of Gray Edwards who absconds or conceals himself so that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him for £3 8/-oo with interest from the 8<sup>th</sup> day of April 1837 and on the sum of £4 5/-oo with interest from the 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 1837 and on the sum of £54 5/-oo with interest from the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April - And the Constable having made return that he had attached in the hands of Jonathan Peale the sum of 23 cents. William Peale the sum of £2 00. Josephine Woods - sum 1 00. John Drake 2 00. one dollar of which has been paid by Josephine Woods and sum named William Davis and Edwards Butts to say what amount they owe the said Edwards. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the said Gray Edwards not appearing it is considered by the court that the said Williams recover against the said Edwards the sums aforesaid with interest thereon as aforesaid. To wit the sum of £8 8/-oo with interest from the 8<sup>th</sup> day of April 1837, the sum of £4 5/-oo with interest from the 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 1837 and the sum of £54 5/-oo with interest from the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April - and his costs by home in this behalf expended - That William Peale pay the plaintiff the sum of £2. Josephine Woods the sum of £1 and John Drake the sum of £2.
