In Chancery

On the motion of the plaintiff a copy of the bill which has been duly sworn to is substituted for the original bill. This cause came on to be debated and heard, by consent of parties, upon the bill, answers of the several defendants, the exhibits filed in the cause and the depositions of sundry witnesses, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Nathaniel M Osborne be appointed a Commissioner on the part of the infant defendants to sell their undivided interest in the tract of land described in the bill of the complainant "as Poplar Swamp or Allens quarter" supposed to contain six thousand two hundred and forty six acres, either in whole or in such parts as may be sold to the greatest advantage or a credit of one, two and three years by equal annual instalments except one third of the purchase money, which shall be for cash, reserving the balance until the whole amount of the purchase money shall be paid - and the said Commissioner is further directed to make report to this Court in order to a final decree.

The Court doth assign John M Dingley guardian to John M Dingley orphan of Henry Dingley deceased, and thereupon the said John M Dingley together with Edwards Dault and William A Sprink his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Ten thousand dollars conditioned according to Law.
