To wit: Southampton County, Tenn. 1840 December 17th. We the undersigned Commissioners in obedience to the aforesaid order have divided the slaves therein mentioned in the following manner. No. 1. Robt. French and Apsant we allot to John Harris \$850.00

and the said John Harris shall pay to No. 2. Sumner after mentioned the sum of 6.25
That not making one fourth part of the whole \$823.75

No. 2. Alice, Edward and Eliza, we allot to Peter Edwards guardian of Aunt Harris, and to pay No. 4 6.25

No. 3. David Perry and Child Peter, we allot to Joseph D. Blount guardian of the heirs of Robert J Musgrave, and to pay to No. 4 6.25

No. 4. Sumner, Billy and Peter, appraised at \$825.00 and to receive from No. 1. 243 \$6.25 each, we allot to John A Brown guardian to Mary C Brown.

The Commissioners appointed to make sale and division of the slaves in the proceedings mentioned this day made report which is ordered to be recorded and is in these words to wit: Southampton County, Tenn. - December 17th 1840 - We the undersigned Commissioners in obedience to the aforesaid order have sold the slaves in the proceedings mentioned for the sum of \$2678.50

We charge Commissioners on the first \$300.00 at 5 per cent 15.00

We also charge 2 per cent on the remaining 2378.50 47.57

Paid Lawyer fee for Bell & answer 10.00

Paid Clerk fee for docketing Book for 2.37

Leaving a balance for distribution of \$2602.56 for which sum of \$61.03.50 we have taken bond at 2 per cent to the several claimants of the distribution, as set forth in the aforesaid order, and have distributed the same accordingly. We have further more deposited the receipts in the clerk's office Wm. Jackson, Nathaniel Francis, Mark S. Paine.

But the widow of Joseph Hollenbeck who made oath and together with George B. Hollenbeck and John Vick his executors, returned oath and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twelve hundred.
