The Commissioner appointed to make sale and division of the property with his friends
and wife this day made a report which is ordered to be read from for exception made in the following
words hereto. Pursuant to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date January 1st
1821 between Silas Turner & Nancy his wife and Silas Piff, against James G. Harris & his
Def'ts. In Chancery did on Friday the 29th day of January 1821 first giving reasonable notice by
advertisement of the time and place of sale, sell the land in the decree mentioned to the highest bidder
on a credit of six months and Joel Briford became the purchaser, his being the highest bid for the
same for the sum of one hundred and ten dollars. And on Monday the first day of February
1821 first giving reasonable notice of the time and place of sale by advertisement, sold the same
in the decree mentioned for costs, a division being impracticable to do justice to all the parties named
