

• Nancy Magot die<sup>d</sup> in the County of Southampton sometime in April last upon the information of Matthew Nick one of their body & Benjamin Reed who was sent for and sworn in Court to give evidence - John Drake & Bennett Joyce for an affault and battery on the body of Charles Ingraham at the house of the said Ingraham in the County of Southampton sometime in the month of May last upon the information of Charles Ingraham who came voluntarily and was sworn in Court to give evidence - And the grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged -

The Court hereby authorizes the grand jury to dispense with the examination of the jail of this County -

On the motion of James James and Thomas C Jones who severally produced the Sheriff's receipts for the Tax imposed by law, and the said James James with Samuel J James his Security, and the said Thomas C Jones with Samuel J Douglas his Security, severally entered into bond on the penalty of one hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs, a license them to keep an Ordinary that is to say the said James James at his residence in this County and the said Thomas C Jones at his lot in Jerusalem in this County till May Term next. It appearing to the Court that the said James James & Thomas C Jones are men of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming -

On the motion of Edwards Bulle against Samuel M Pond and Hopkins Pond. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendants have had legal notice of this action they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is resolved by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendants the sum of sixteen dollars and fifty two cents with interest thereon from the 26<sup>th</sup> day of August 1835 till the 25<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 and the further sum of ten dollars & eighty six cents with legal interest thereon from the 26<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 till the said 25<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 (being the sum collected by the said Samuel M Pond in the character of Constable) and which he has refused to pay to the plaintiff together with fifteen per cent damages of the whole amount thereof from the said 25<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 till paid and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended. And the said Defendants are Mordifield.

On the motion of Nathan Parsons or surviving partner of himself with R Strong Esq<sup>r</sup> as co-Exr. of Rich R Strong Esq<sup>r</sup> against James A W Glenny George A W Glenny and Henry Holloman - For costs appearing to the Court this action is continued till the next Term -

On the motion of George W Holloman. Ordered that Phineas McDanley be appointed Special Commissioner being sworn for the purpose to state, settle and adjust the said George W Holloman's administration on John Holloman's estate and make a report thereof to Court -

On the motion of Josiah Holloman. Ordered that Phineas McDanley be appointed Special Commissioner being sworn for the purpose to state, settle and adjust the said Josiah Holloman's administration on Elizabeth Freeman's estate and make a report thereof to Court -

Ordered that John R Chamberly Commissioner of the Court of Greenville State, settle and adjust James W Stewart's guardian account of William T Michlow and make a report thereof to Court.
