On the motion of David H Joyner. Ordered that the Clerk deliver to him unless otherwise filed in the Office of this Court as the proportion of the said David Joyner of the sales of the land of Nathan Joyner Esq<sup>r</sup>. Sold by Commissioners.

On the motion of Anthony V Williams who produced to the Court the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law and with William D Goddard his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs as heresay is granted him to keep an ordinary at his residence in Jerusalem till May Term next it appearing to the Court that the said Anthony V Williams is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

Dear Mr Joyner who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the complaint of Charles Ingraham against him for absence of the several appearances in discharge of his recognizance and the said Charles Ingraham being sworn and examined. and the said Bennett Joyner fully heard. It is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said D Wm Joyner shall give security for keeping the peace for the sum of twelve months from this day the said Joyner to be bound in the sum of One hundred dollars with four securities in the sum of twenty five dollars each. and that the said D Bennett Joyner pay the costs of the prosecution Whereupon the said Bennett Joyner with William Cobb Benjamin Cobb Strandwick Patrell and Joseph O Munday his associates herein in Court severally acknowledge themselves indebted unto John Rutherford Esq<sup>r</sup> Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia that is to say the said Bennett Joyner the sum of One hundred dollars and the said William Cobb Benjamin Cobb Strandwick Patrell and Joseph O Munday in the sum of twenty five dollars each to be bound of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements and to the said Governor and his successors in the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth on such terms upon this condition that if the said Bennett Joyner shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards the Commonwealth and all its citizens more especially towards the said Charles Ingraham then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue -
