

On the motion of Jacob Williams setting forth that he is bound in this Court as security for Drury Beale for his good behavior of Stanley Turner and that he conceives himself in danger of suffering thereby, and praying the Court for relief. It is ordered that the said Drury Beale be summoned to the next Court to show cause if any he can why he should not be ruled to give Jacob Williams good counter security according to Law.

On the motion of David D. Joyner, ordered that the Clerk deliver to him unless a day, a bond filed in the office of this Court as the proposition of the said David Joyner of the sales of the land of Richard Joyner &c. sold by Commissioners.

On the motion of Anthony A. Williams who produced to the Court the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law and with William B. Gardiner his security entered into and acknowledged abroad in the penalty of One hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs as herein is granted him to keep an ordinary at his residence in Jonesboro' till May Term next, it appearing to the Court that the said Anthony A. Williams is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

On the motion of the said Joyner who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the complaint of Charles Ingraham against him for breach of the peace appeared in discharge of his recognizance, and the said Charles Ingraham being sworn and examined, and the said David Joyner fully heard, it is the opinion of the Court and accordingly ordered that the said David Joyner shall give security for keeping the peace for the term of twelve months from this day, the said Joyner to be bound in the sum of One hundred dollars with four securities in the sum of twenty five dollars each, and that the said David Joyner pay the costs of this prosecution. Whereupon the said David Joyner with William Cobb, Benjamin Cobb, Shadrach Pettrell and Joseph B. Munday, his friends, here in Court lawfully acknowledged themselves in debt to the said Governor and his successors in the sum of One hundred dollars, and the said William Cobb, Benjamin Cobb, Shadrach Pettrell and Joseph B. Munday, in the sum of twenty five dollars each, to be bound of their respective goods and chattels bonds and Securities and to the said Governor and his successors in the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth, on such Yett upon this condition that if the said David Joyner shall keep the peace and keep good behavior towards the Commonwealth and all its citizens, more especially towards the said Charles Ingraham then this recognizance to be void as also to remain in full force and virtue.

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
