Lundy and Len Waller two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between Len Waller of the first part James B. Lundy of the second part and Nathaniel Francis of the third part conveying a tract of land containing 500 acres more or less, also the following slaves Joseph, Mollis Nancy, Jacob Fanny, Newton, Jack Billy, Henry and David, was acknowledged in the Clarks Office on the 26th day of June 1841 by James B. Lundy and Len Waller two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of Trust between James Abbotson of the first part, Littleton R. Edwards of the second part and Richard Hallcomb of the third part conveying one negro boy named Nelson aged about 16 years was acknowledged in the Clarks Office on the 26th day of June 1841 by two of the parties thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of Bargain and Sale from Bennett J. Griffin and Sarah his wife to Littleton R. Edwards conveying a tract of land containing 9 acres & more and less was acknowledged in the Clarks Office on the 9th day of July 1841 by Bennett J. Griffin and together with the certificate annexed of the foregoing examination and acknowledgments of the wife admitted to Record.
