

shall have and receive all the privileges enjoyed upon the former Trustee Joseph Proctor by the aforesaid deed of Trust bearing date the 19<sup>th</sup> day of October 1826 to which the said Matthew Drake, James Scott and Joseph Proctor were parties and that the said John Drury shall in all respects be substituted for the former Trustee Joseph Proctor and it is further ordered and decreed that the costs of this suit be proportionably borne by the parties -

For reasons appearing to the Court the Indentures by which Drury held, formerly, was bound to Matthew Drake are hereby transferred to Matthew Drake -

Ordered that Master Commissioners held examine State and settle an account of School & Persons administration in Virginia of Stevens estate and make report thereof to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to State.

Ordered that Master Commissioners held examine State and settle an additional account of School & Persons administration in David Stevens estate and make report thereof to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to State.

For reasons appearing to the Court Ordered that the Overseers of the poor bind David Warren a servant to Benjamin Cobb according to law, communiting with the said Cobb that he pay, David Warren the master of said boy five dollars on the said boy arriving at the age of ten years, seven dollars on his arrival at the age of eleven years, nine dollars on his arrival to the age of twelve years, ten dollars on his arrival to the age of thirteen years, twelve dollars at the age of fourteen years, fifteen dollars on his arrival to the age of fifteen years, seventeen dollars on his arrival to the age of sixteen years, nineteen dollars on his arrival to the age of seventeen years, twenty dollars on his arrival to the age of eighteen years, twenty-two dollars on his arrival to the age of nineteen years, twenty-four dollars on his arrival to the age of twenty years, and twenty-five dollars to be paid to the said apprentice at the age of twenty-one years -

Ordered that the Overseers of the poor receive on their list Martina James a young child of Margaret Glover and provide for her according to Law -

On the motion of Abram Riddick against Joseph C. Smith the guardian to Mary Compton, alias Cobb for unpaid Secuity - This day the said Joseph C. Smith with William P. Craft, General R. Hartman, Jep. Johnson and Thomas Barnes his witnesses here in Court entered into bond in the sum of Two thousand dollars payable to the said Abram Riddick and conditioned as the law directs which Secuity was accepted by the said Riddick -

Be it remembered that William Howell with Anthony M. Howell and others held his securities here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford ex Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, that is to say the said William Howell in the sum of One hundred dollars and the said Anthony M. Howell and others Cobb in the sum of One hundred dollars each, of their respective goods and chattels lands and immovable effects and to the said acting Governor and his Successors in the office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth rendered - But after this condition
