This cause came at this day to be again heard upon the papers formerly read and the report of the Commissioners made at the last term to which no exception has been filed and was argued by Counsel on consideration whereof the Court affirming and confirming the said report with a judge order and decree that the sale and division of the premises mentioned be held firm and shall and binding between the parties.

Robert Riddick Dantes and Littleberry W Macon who have been duly sworn to practice the law in the Courts of this Commonwealth in these justices have leave to practice in this Court and thereupon they took the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth and the oath of an attorney at Law.

On the motion of Benjamin Lewis attorney in fact for Sterling Davis and wife. Ordered that the Clerk deliver to the said Davis a bona fides in the Office of this Court as the possession of said Davis of the sales of the land of Hardy Applaudate doct.

The last Will and Testament of Temperance Moore doct. was proved by the oath of Henry Moore another witness thereto. And on the motion of Henry Moore the executor therein named who made oath thereto according to Law and with Newt Drow and John W Reese his decessors entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for drawing a probat of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Peter Edwards, John A Brown, Nathaniel Francis and Mark A James any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Temperance Moore doct. and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

A Power of attorney from Henry Moore to Richard A Blunt was acknowledged by the said Henry Moore to be his act and deed and ordered to be recorded.

The last will and Testament of Polly Connors deceased was proved by the oath of Will D Gray, Thomas B Wright and Newt E Johnson the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

Nathaniel Jones foreman, Goodman E Johnson, Jesse Cobb, Patrick Ross, James Noble, Joseph Goodlier, James C Clayton, Joseph C Connors, Jesse D Raley, Jesse Cabell, Patrick H Hollings, Newt Drow, Edwin Harris, John W Reese, Simon J Westbrook, Henry Boyce, William Holt, Thomas A Westbrook, Lawrence Pope, Levi E Waller, Jacob Boyce, foreman Drake and seven a grand jury of inquest upon the body of this County and having received their charge with done and after same have returned into Court and presented.
