On the motion of Benjamin Lewis attorney in fact for Sterling Davis and wife. Ordered that the Clerk deliver to the said Davis a bond filed in the Office of this Court as the proportion of said Davis of the costs of the land of Hardy & Phillips dec'd?

And on the motion of Henry Moore the executor thereon named who made oath thereto according to Law and with Peter Davis and John H Rose his deponents natural interest acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Peter Edwards, John A Person, Nathaniel Francis and Mark A James any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do apprise all the personal estate of Temperance Moore dec'd and return the apprise ment under their hands to Court.

A Power of attorney from Henry Moore to Richard C Blunt was acknowledged by the said Henry Moore to be his act and deed and ordered to be recorded.

The last will and Testament of Polly Tommons deceased was proved by the oaths of Hills D Gray, Thomas D Knight and Newell E Johnson the Subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.
