The Road leading from the fish road to the Church on the evidence of Emma Bryant who was sworn in Court and sent to the Grand Jury to give evidence.

And the grand jury, having nothing further to present was discharged.

Ordered that process be issued against the persons presented by the grand jury at this Court to answer the said processments returnable here at November Term next.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County out of any contingent moneys in his hands pay unto Joseph B. Mendenhall the sum of \$7.50 for procuring and to William Dale the sum of \$12. for procuring and for working on the road.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon the Justices of this County to attend on the first day of the next Term for the purpose of making a recommendation of other persons to be appointed and commissioned Judges of this said County.

A deed of bargain and sale from William P. Nicholas to John P. Adams was acknowledged by the said Nicholas and ordered to be recorded.

A Deed of bargain and sale from Riggs County to Richard A. Bellman was proved by John A. Benson and Howell Harris two of the witnesses thereto.

A Deed of bargain and sale from Richard A. Bellman to Riggs County was proved by the oath of John A. Benson and Howell Harris two of the witnesses thereto.

A Deed of Trust between Lemuel P. Nicholas and wife of the first part, William B. Edwards of the second part and William A. Sparks and others of the third part was acknowledged by the said Lemuel P. Nicholas and together with the certificate of the paying commissioner and acknowledgment of the wife ordered to be recorded.

It appears to the Court from the testimony of Augustine Pope and Bennett D. Whitfield credible witnesses that Holladay Reville a Revolutionary pensioner died in this County on the 10th day of May 1841 that he left no widow but the following heirs to wit: John Reville, Benjamin Reville, Samuel Reville, Matthew Reville formerly Reville, Rebecca Westphal formerly Reville, Lucy Blair formerly Reville, sons & daughters and Nancy Whitfield & William Reville grand children of the said Holladay Reville dec'd. Which is ordered to be certified.

On the motion of Simon Murphey to allow the road running from Leitchburg to Jerusalem on said Murphey's land. Ordered that Henry J. Smith, Jesse Parker and Edward Campbell being sworn before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose do view the way proposed for the said road
