Joseph J. Claude and Edwin B. Claude for fighting in the Clerk's Office in Southwicks County on the 16th of August 1841 on the evidence of James E. Clayton one of our body who was sworn in Court to give evidence. and

The Road leading from the fish road to rock church on the evidence of George Bryant who was sworn in Court and sent to the Grand Jury to give evidence.

And the grand jury having nothing further to present was discharged.

Ordered that process be issued against the persons presented by the grand jury at this Court to answer the said complaints returnable here at November Term next.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County out of any contingent moneys in his hands pay unto Joseph W. Mardon the sum of \$7.50 for prosecuting and to William Peale the sum of \$12. for prosecuting and for working on the road.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon the Justices of this County to attend on the first day of the next Term for the purpose of making a recommendation of other persons to be appointed and confirmed Justices of the said County.

A Deed of bargain and sale from William P. Nicholson to John G. Ward was acknowledged by the said Nicholson and ordered to be recorded.

A Deed of bargain and sale from Boyd Lundy to Richard A. Bellamy was given by John A. Person and Howell Harris two of the witnesses thereto.

A Deed of bargain and sale from Richard A. Bellamy to Boyd Lundy was given by the both of John A. Person and Howell Harris two of the witnesses thereto.

A Deed of Trust between Lemuel P. Nicholson and wife of the first part, Elizabeth B. Edwards of the second part and William A. Sparks and others of the third part was acknowledged by the said Lemuel P. Nicholson and together with the certificate of the party commissioners and acknowledgement of the wife ordered to be recorded.

It appears to the Court from the testimony of Augustus Pope and Bennett K. Whipple that credible witness that Holladay Revelle a Revolutionary Patriot died in this County on the 24th day of May 1821, that he left no widow but the following heirs to wit, John Revelle, Benjamin Revelle, Samuel Revelle, Nathan Raymond formerly Revelle, Rebecca Hedges, formerly Revelle, Lucy Blair formerly Revelle, sons & daughters and Nancy Whipple & William Revelle grand children of the said Holladay Revelle etc. Whipple is ordered to be certified.

On the motion of Simon Murphy for leave to alter the road running from Southway to Somerton on said Murphys lands. Ordered that Hennings T. Smith, C. Fox Parker and Edward Bonaparte being sworn before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose do view the road proposed for the said road
