On the return of the defendant by his attorney who pleaded payment to which the plaintiff by their attorney replied generally the judgments obtained in the Office against the defendant are admitted and the cause are continued till the next quarterly Term.

James a negro man slave belonging to Russell Williams of this County who hath been committed to the jail of this County charged with entering the house of Masor Pope by running the fastening of the window sash of said house and feloniously taking and carrying away the following spoils to wit three ladies dresses three dresses of a smaller size, five dollars & 25 Cents in cash, one silk handkerchief, two lawn dresses, one counterpane, Wheat Coffee pot, four yards of Calico, bed quilt about half finished and one pair cotton stockings, the whole value amounting to thirty dollars, twenty five Cents. was led to the bar in custody of the Jailor of this Court (the Court summoned for his trial having failed to meet) and being duly arraigned pleaded not guilty. Whereupon sundry witnesses were sworn and examined and the prisoner by his Counsel fully heard. The Court after hearing the testimony and from all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is not guilty of the felony of which he stands charged, and proclamation being made as the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be discharged from custody.

The Attorney for the said Russell Williams by consent of the Court, swears that he will not prosecute further in behalf of the Commissioners against Arthur Chappell who stands accused of Forgery. Therefore it is ordered that the said Arthur Chappell be discharged from his imprisonment.

William Howell late of the County of Southampton who stands charged of elopement appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance: and the grand jury having returned the Indictment against him not a true bill proclamation was made as the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against him it is ordered that he be discharged from his imprisonment.

Polly Hard the widow of Hartwell Hard dec^d appeared in Court and renounced the personal made for her by the will of her said husband and declared that she will take or accept the same or any part thereof.

On the motion of Dawsey Bells Ordered that Master Commissioner Bell examine states and settle an account of the said Bells guardianship of Henry Turner and make report thereof to Court with any matters specially stated deemed proper by himself or which he may be required to state.
