On the order of Edy Seeth for negro, to establish the annuities will of Edy Seeth dec'd, free negro, John Rogers and Nancy Rogers being sworn depose and say, that she said Edy Seeth on the 15th day of July 1841 at her residence in this County, during her last illness and while in her proper senses, called upon them the said John Rogers and Nancy Rogers, and stated that she desired her will to be as follows: "she desired for her grand son Edy Seeth to have her trunk and bed goods and her son David and Daughter Edy to have all the rest of her property to be equally divided between them, and if Matthew Seeth and Marian Seeth come in they are to have each five shillings" - And it is ordered that David Seeth Matthew Seeth and Marian Seeth be summoned by the next Court to contest the will.

For reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that John D. Hart, Edmund Rockelle, and David Boyant or any two of them do view and report to the Court the most eligible site for a road from the fish road near James Magels to Doctors Road, and from Doctors Road by Rockells mill to Sandyridge road.
