On the demand of Edy Scott, freeholder, to establish the unexecuted Will of Octo. Scott dec^d, free Negro, John Dwyer and Nancy Dwyer being sworn deponents say that the said Octo. Scott on the 1st day of July 1828 at his residence in this County, during his last illness and while in his proper senses called upon them the said John Dwyer and Nancy Dwyer, and directed that the desired last will to be as follows: "She desired for her grand son John Scott to have her trunk and bed-gutts and her son David and Daughter Emily to have all the rest of her property to be equally divided between them and if Matthew Scott and Marian Scott come in they are to have each five shillings" And it is ordered that David Scott and Matthew Scott and Marian Scott be summoned to the next Court to contest the will.

Louis Vick having obtained an attachment against the goods and chattels of Ward Powell his tenant for eleven dollars per month, which will become due on the 1st day of January 1829 and the timeable having by virtue thereof attached sundry goods and chattels of the said Ward Powell. On the motion of R. W. J. Daniel who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law no license is granted him to keep a house of private entertainment at his residence in this County till May next next.

The Register of Pleasant Valley, free Negro, was examined and certified to be truly made.

For reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that John D. Hart, Clemente Rockwell and Davis Bryant or any two of them do view and report to the Court the most eligible site for a road from the falls road near James Mayhew to Doctors Road, and from Doctors road by Rockwells mill to Sandy ridge road.
