The Commissioners heretofore appointed in this cause this day made their report in
these words to wit: "According to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing
date November Court 1840 and to us directed, we thereunto signed have acted upon
that part of the decree as relates to the slaves and report as follows to wit:
To Jane Beale formerly Jane Williams we have assigned negro man John and old negro
man Phe as slaves of slaves. To William L Williams we have assigned negro man
Mass. To James Vick as guardian at law of Joseph T Williams, old negro
woman Amy, old man Hugo & boy, infern, Henry and to receive from Elizabeth W
Williams the sum of thirty three dollars & 33/100. To James Vick guardian at law
of Elizabeth W Williams we have assigned girl Hester and boy Solomon and to pay
Joseph T Williams the sum of thirty three dollars & 33/100. That part of the decree
that relates to the real estate we have not acted on. The parties concerned in a quarrel of
age, and as long the real estate not decided among them at this time is the cause of its
not being acted on. All of which is respectfully submitted. Given under our hands
this 10th day of July 1841. John Davis, Robert Richs, Benjamin Story." -
That part of the above decree which refers to the sale of land has been carried into effect
in the following manner. First, after duly advertising said land for thirty days at
two or more public places I did on the 18th day of Dec. 1840 on the premises
expose said land to public sale on a credit of six months except so much as to defray
the expenses, at which sale Benjamin Story became the purchaser (he being the
highest bidder) at three hundred and fifty one dollars: after deducting the expenses
I paid three bonds of equal amounts - one of which I paid over to Wm L Williams,
one to Jas Vick as guardian of Joseph T Williams & one to said Jas Vick as
guardian to Elizabeth W Williams - All of which is most respectfully submitted.

one hundred dollars with two sureties in the sum of fifty dollars each, and that he also
pay the costs of this presentation.
