It is remembered, that Richard Edwards with Thomas Barnes and Spikes Brink
his debtors here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford Esq;

and be of good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth more especially towards
Elizabeth Butchens of this County for the term of twelve months from this day, then this recogni-
zance to be void or else to remain in full force.

John A Turner and Mills E Lawrence having been guilty of a breach of the peace by
fighting together in publick in the Court yard, were brought into Court and being bound it is
the opinion of the Court that the said John A Turner give security for his keeping the peace for
the space of twelve months from this day, that is to say, the said John A Turner to be bound
in the sum of One hundred dollars with his debtors in the sum of fifty dollars each.
Whereupon the said John A Turner with Thomas C Jones and John W Rockelle his debtors
here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford Esq;
Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the sum of
A Turner in the sum of One hundred dollars and the said Jones & Rockelle in the sum of
fifty dollars each, of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied
and to the said Governor and his successors for the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth
rendered. Yet upon this condition that of the said John A Turner shall keep the
peace and be of good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth for the term of
twelve months from this day, then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force
and value.

Nancy Whitfield orphan of Esther Whitfield deceased made choice of Bennett S Whitfield
for her guardian and thereupon the said Bennett S Whitfield with Peter Bergman and
Benjamin Whitfield his debtors entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of two
thousand dollars conditioned according to law.

A Deed of Bargain and Sale from John M Gentry former planter to Esther Gardner was acknowl-
edged by the said Gentry and ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of John S Hanes against Samuel C H Pond, David Bell and Robert Rice
it appearing to the Court that the defendants have had legal notice of this action and they not ap-
pearing the said action is continued till the next Term.
