The Clerk this day returned the following list of deeds &c admitted to record in the Clerk's Office of this Court since September Court 1841 to wit.

Deed of bargain and sale from William Jagger and Mary his wife to Polly Jagger conveying a tract of land containing 50 acres more or less was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 20th day of September 1841 by the said William Jagger and admitted to record.

Deed of Trust between Benjamin W. Washam of the first part Thomas Ridley of the second part and Joseph A. Washam of the third part conveying one barrel more one bag more two cows and thirteen pigs, two sheaves Washam's growing crop of corn fodder and cotton, one gun, one clock farming utensils, household and kitchen furniture and all his other property which he the said W. Washam claims in possession of, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 20th day of September 1841 by all the parties thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Zachary Story and Polly himself and others to Isaac Bell conveying a tract of land containing 159 acres be the same more or less was proved in the Clerk's Office on the 20th of September 1841 by the witnesses thereto and together with the certificate of the proxy examination and acknowledgment of the wife admitted to record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Polly Stephenson to William S. Stephenson conveying a tract of land containing 58 acres more or less was proved in the Clerk's Office on the 20th day of September 1841 by the oath of M. Blomonds one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proved on the 25th June 1841 by William Stephenson and on the 19th of April 1841 by Benjamin A. Griffin two other witnesses thereto was admitted to record.

Deed of Trust between James J. Williams of the first part James Bell of the second part and Horaw Reddick of the third part conveying a tract of land containing 150 acres, three saddle and bridle, three head, and furniture 20 hogs, 20 barrels of corn, 1000 pounds hams, also his the said Williams entire stock of goods, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 20th September 1841 by the parties thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of Trust between John A. Turner of the first part, James D. Dwyer of the second part and John M. Dunley and others of the third part conveying two the said Turners present growing crop of cotton and all the surplus that may be coming to hand after satisfying the liabilities which he had made previously was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office on the 20th day of September 1841 by John A. Turner and James D. Dwyer two of the parties thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of Trust between Jacob Jordan of the first part Robert S. Downes of the second part and Thomas B. Worrell of the third part conveying one gig and harness, a large iron safe, four fifths of the said Jordan's present growing crop of corn and peas and all his crop of fodder and all the surplus which may be coming to hand after satisfying the several debts & Trust he had given previously, was proved in the Clerk's Office on the 29th September 1841 by the oath of Henry Jones one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proved on the 20th September 1841 by Lill, Page, Anderson & Joseph Ferguson two other witnesses thereto was admitted to record.
