The Clerk this day returned the following list of deeds &c admitted to record in the Clerks Office of this Court since September Court 1841 to wit.

Deed of bargain and sale from William Jagger and Mary his wife to Polly Jagger conveying a tract of land containing 30 acres more or less was acknowledged in the Clerks Office on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 1841 by the said William Jagger and admitted to record.

Deed of trust between Benjamin W. Barham of the first part Thomas Ridley of the second part and Joseph A. Barham of the third part conveying one barrel more or less more two pens and sixteen pigs, his the said Barham growing crop of corn fodder and cobolt, one cow, one cloth farming utensile, household and kitchen furniture and all his other property which he the said W. A. Barham is now in possession of was acknowledged in the Clerks Office on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 1841 by all the parties thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Zachariah Story and Polly his wife and others to Jane Holt conveying a tract of land containing 16 9/10 acres the same more or less was recorded in the Clerks Office on the 20<sup>th</sup> of September 1841 by the witnesses thereto and together with the certificate of survey examination and acknowledgement of the wife admitted to record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Polly Stephenson to William G. Stephenson conveying a tract of land containing 38 acres more or less was recorded in the Clerks Office on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 1841 by the oath of M. Clements one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proven on the 25<sup>th</sup> June 1841 by William Stephenson and on the 29<sup>th</sup> of April last by Edmund D. Coffey two other witnesses thereto was acknowledged to record.

Deed of trust between James J. Williams of the first part James Cobb of the second part and Abram Reddick of the third part conveying a tract of land containing 150 acres, horse, saddle and bridle and stock and furniture 20 sheep, 20 barrels of corn, 1,000 pounds bacon also but the said Williams entire stock of goods was acknowledged in the Clerks Office on the 20<sup>th</sup> September 1841 by the parties thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of trust between John A. Turner of the first part, James D. Bryant of the second part and John M. Bailey and others of the third part conveying his the said Turners personal growing crop of tobacco and all the surplus that may be coming to him after satisfying the bonds held which he had made previously was acknowledged in the Clerks Office on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 1841 by John A. Turner and James D. Bryant two of the parties thereto and admitted to record.

Deed of trust between Jacob Jordan of the first part Robert E. Brown of the second part and Thomas P. Howell of the third part conveying a pig and twenty large wine bottles four fifths of this the said Jordans present growing crop of corn and peas and all his crop of fodder and all the surplus which may be coming to him after satisfying the several bonds of trust he had given previously was proved in the Clerks Office on the 29<sup>th</sup> September 1841 by the oath of Henry Jones one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proven on the 20<sup>th</sup> September 1841 by Littlepage Anderson & Joseph Ferguson two other witnesses thereto was admitted to record.
