In Chancery

The Commissioners appointed in this cause this day made their report, which is in their words to wit: "In conformity to the annexed decree we the Commissioners appointed at Dear Court to divide the lands & negroes belonging to the estate of Rufus Hart dec^d. We Shugars Law, James C. Little & J. C. Correll have allotted to the widow Margaret A. D. Hart one third part of all the lands in a location, together with the improvements. One third part in valuation to Almond D. Hart, namely the tract of land called Swamp-oreville tract lying on Swamp Swamp commencing at a maple tree at Almond Stephensons line, thence to an apple tree, thence to a pine, a corner tree, thence to a red oak, thence to a large sweet gum and to a forked hick Cypress at the Swamp, which divides the land between widow and Almond Hart. The line between widow and Georgiana E. Hart commences at a white oak at Stephensons line, thence to a pine tree, thence to a small oak bush thence to the post of the shelter at the crib, thence to a post of the yard, which is a corner, thence to a poplar in the bottom, down said bottom to the Swamp. The lands west course of the aforesaid line towards Drury Branches line together with the Windham tract, we have allotted to Georgiana E. Hart. We also allot to Widow one negro woman and a child valued to be worth three hundred & fifty dollars - We allot to Almond D. Hart one negro girl named Emma valued to be worth three hundred & fifty dollars. We also allot to Georgiana E. Hart two small negro girls named Eliza & Charles valued to be worth three hundred & fifty dollars. The above divisions is correct to the best of our judgment. Given under our hands this 28th day of January 1851. Shugars Law, James C. Little, J. C. Correll."

Sarah Hart the widow of J. S. Hart dec^d. relinquished her rights to the administration of her deceased husbands estate and on the instant Benjamin Crofford who made oath and together with Patrick Dolan and Robert B. Crofford his executors entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of four thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted herefor returning letters of administration with the estate of the said J. S. Hart deceased in due form.

Ordered that Shugars Law, George Holliman, Benjamin L. Drow and Alfred T. Stephenson or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of J. S. Hart deceased and
