We have also viewed the ground on which the new road will run and find it far better than that on which the old road now runs and it will also shorten the distance for the hands now working the South Quay & Jerusalem road 846 yards suffering them to stop at the junction of the Franklin and South Quay where it will lengthen the road for the hands now working the Franklin & Jerusalem Road but 200 yards letting them continue 846 at the Cedar Swamp where the former hands now stop with it. - H.
