Day the widow of part of the whole in view of her wife estate, of the remainder pay to C.H. & Lawrence apiece of Slave et Turner one third and the other two thirds pay to the heirs of Nathaniel Rochester, and report his savings to the Court in order to a final decree.

Bull, Thomas Stanley, Allen Stephenson, Silas Charles, Burton Taylor, Lewis W. Cole, Samuel D. Woodard, Benjamin Waller, Joseph Pope, Patrick Ross, Baswell Worrell, Joseph H. Hollings, and William T. Bryant were sworn a grand jury of inquest upon the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and presented.

Alfred Bell for removing and recovery from Harrison & Moore Constable in the County of Southampton and within the jurisdiction of this Court, Corn which he had laid upon to sell upon the voluntary information of Horace D. Moore & James Vaughan - And the Grand Jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

Ordered that the persons presented by the grand jury be summoned to appear quarterly Term to show cause if any they can why an information should not be filed against them upon the said presentments.

On the motion of Joseph E. Island. Ordered that Master Commissioner Bell examine State and settle an additional account of the said Island's administration on Robert J. Moore's estate and make report thereof to the Court with any matters specially stated therein pertaining by himself or which he may be required to state.

The defendant Tele. joyner who is out of this Commonwealth and against whom the plaintiff seem to have proceeded with the mode provided by law against defendant having failed to appear and file his answer the bill of the plaintiff is taken for confessed to him; and the other defendants in whom the defendant seems to have been created and the bills of the plaintiff filed more than four months, and they having failed to comply and file their answers - and the several suits joined in the cause having been regularly executed and got an appearance made for the defendants the bill of the plaintiff is taken for confessed as to all the defendants. This cause came on to be heard on the original and consolidated bills, which filed and was argued by Counsel. On Consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the aforesaid Tele. joyner pay to the plaintiff Jacob Butler Seventy one dollars and twelve cents with interest thereon from the 22nd day of November 1834 to date past; and that he pay to Anthony A. Howell one of the plaintiffs the sum of One hundred and Sixty Two dollars eighty cents with interest thereon from the 26th day of January 1834 to date past; and that he pay to the plaintiff the costs in this suit expended.
