Wells & Laurence oblige of John et Turner one third and the other two thirds pay to the heirs of Nathaniel Rockwell, and report this doing to the Court in order to a final decree.

Cobb, Samuel D. Woodward, Benjamin Waller, Joseph Tipton, Patrick Rice, Caswell Worrell, Jesse A. Hollings, and William T. Bryant, were sworn a grand jury of inquest upon the body of this County and having received their charge withdrew and after sometime returned into Court and proceeded.

Alfred Cobb for removing and rescuing from Harriet D. Moore Constable in the County of Southampton and within the jurisdiction of this Court, cows which he had hired upon & sold upon the voluntary information of Harriet D. Moore & James Vassenger. And the Grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

Ordered that the persons presented by the grand jury be summoned to the next quarterly Term to show cause if any they can why any information should not be filed against them upon the said presentments.

On the motion of Joseph D. Alcock. Ordered that Master Commissioners both of the State and of the County make an additional account of the said Alcock's administration in Robert D. Man- graw's estate and make report thereof to the Court with any matters especially stated demanded pursuant by himself or which he may be required to state.

The defendant Eli Jagger who is out of this Commonwealth and against whom the plaintiffs seem to have proceeded in the mode presented by law against absent defendants having failed to appear and file his answer the bill of the plaintiffs is taken for confessed as to him: and the other defendants on whom the subpoena seems to have been executed and the bills of the plaintiffs filed more than four months, and they having failed to comply and file their answer - and the several writs issued in the cause having been regularly executed and got no appearance made for the defendants the bill of the plaintiffs is taken for confessed as to all the defendants. This cause came on to be heard on the original and amended bills, exhibits filed and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order, and decree that the aforesaid Eli Jagger pay to the plaintiffs James Butler, George M. Dillon and Arthur C. Coe with interest thereon from the 22^d day of November 1827 till paid, and that the jury to Anthony A. Howell one of the plaintiffs the sum of One hundred and sixty Two dollars eighty Cents with interest thereon from the 28th day of January 1828 till paid, and that the jury to the plaintiffs the costs in this suit expended.
