

that the Clerk of this Court deliver to the plaintiffs or their attorney, a bond filed by the bondsmen in the Suit of Whitehead versus and Sagar in this Court payable to James DeLapenbergh, James Coth and Jordan Edwards for fifty dollars to be paid due 1st January 1837 and executed by C. & K. Howell and Gray Edwards, to be paid in part Satisfaction of the debt due to the said James Butler; and that the Sheriff of this County sell to the highest bidder for Cash 1/2 of the estate in the possession of Honor Daughtry or her Committee to which she is entitled for her life under the will of Thomas Daughtry and which one seventh part, by the will of said Thomas Daughtry belongs, in the death of the said Honor Daughtry to Charlotte Daughtry who married Holley and Holland and which one seventh has become the property of said Eli Sagar in remainder and out of the proceeds thereof, pay first the costs of this Suit and pay the amount due the plaintiffs after the application of the aforesaid bond - and the balance if any the Sheriff shall bring into Court subject to the further order in this Suit - That if the whole fund now decreed towards the Satisfaction of the plaintiffs demands shall not be enough to discharge the same, then they shall be paid ratably - But the plaintiffs are not to have the benefit of this decree until the plaintiffs or one of them or some one for them shall have filed in the Clerk's Office of this Court bond with good security in double the amount of their respective claims undertaken to abide such further order as may be made for restoring the effects of the above defendant upon his appearance and answering the bill of the plaintiffs &c But no such sale shall be made unless upon at least thirty days notice of the time and place of sale, nor unless the defendant Eli Sagar shall fail to pay the plaintiffs for thirty days their respective demands aforesaid together with the costs of this Suit.

On the motion of Simon M. Moser for leave to alter the road running from South quay to Jerusalem or said Moser bank - The Commissioners appointed to view the way this day made report which is in these words to wit: "In obedience to the court's order we the undersigned have viewed the said Road and find it opened and in good repair and has remained as the public highway from South quay to Jerusalem and all of which we respectfully submit to the Honorable Court of Southampton County - Given under our hands this thirtieth of December 1836. Jesse Parker, Edward C. Crumpler, Jordan Edwards." "It is the order of the Court that the Surveyor of the road leading from South quay to the Cedar Swamp should stop at the end of the new road joining the Franklin road and the Surveyor of the road leading from Franklin to Jerusalem should be directed to work to the run of the Cedar Swamp. Jesse Parker, Edward C. Crumpler."

"Whereupon it is ordered that the road as opened be removed and established a bridge by way of crossing the river of the Cedar Swamp. For reasons appearing to the Court Ordered that the Surveyor of the road leading from South quay to the Cedar Swamp do stop at the end of the new road joining the Franklin road and that the Surveyor of the road leading from Franklin to Jerusalem do work to the run of the Cedar Swamp."
