Yet upon this condition that if the said Drury Wolfe shall keep and observe the above order of the Court made against him then the above obligation to be levied or else to remain in full force and virtue.

Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia that is to say the said Joseph B. Council in the sum of three hundred dollars and the said James M. Council and John P. Weyburn in the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars, of their respective goods and Chattels lands and Tenements to be levied and to the said acting Governor and his Successors in the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Joseph B. Council shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour towards the Commonwealth and all its Citizens more especially towards the said Patrick Dole for the Term of twelve months from this day then this recognizance to be void.
