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dollars and the said George & Council and James C. Council in the sum of One hundred dollars each, of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his successors in the office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that of the said William C. Council shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards the Commonwealth and all its Citizens more especially towards the said Patrick Dole for the space of twelve months from this day than this recognizance to be void.

Jeremiah Joyner who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the complaint of William Gardner against him for a breach of the peace appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance and the said William Gardner being sworn and examined and the said Joyner by Council fully heard the Court after hearing the Testimony are of opinion and do therefore order that the said Joyner give Security for keeping the peace for the term of twelve months from this day that is to say the said Joyner to be bound in the sum of twenty dollars with two securities in the sum of ten dollars each and that he pay the costs of this prosecution And therupon the said Joyner with James P. French and William C. Sparks his securities here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford Esq<sup>r</sup> Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Joyner to pay in the sum of Twenty Dollars and his said securities in the sum of ten dollars each, of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his successors in Office & the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Jeremiah Joyner shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the Citizens of the Commonwealth more especially towards William Gardner for the term of twelve months from this day than this recognizance to be void.
